

I purchased the Gandhi DK biography and was really surprised. DK is well known for their complex layouts with numerous pictures, drawings, and outtakes. They've done an excellent job with this biography providing frames that discuss historical and religious aspects, such as Hinduism, that are critical to Gandhi's life, but would deviate from the story being told if they were integrated into it. The writing is easy for a late elementary reader, but very informative with numerous details of Gandhi's life that I didn't expect in such a short volume. I, however, still prefer to read it with my children as there are many historical and geographical references that can be expanded upon. I feared that the paperback book would fall apart easily, especially with the thick, glossy pages, but it has been remarkably strong.

My 13 year old son had to read a biography of a non American who influenced the world. He loved this book. It was an easy read and he learned so much about Gandhi. He told me things I never knew which has made me want to read this book, too.

My youngest daughter has some strange interests occasionally! I was kind of surprised when she wanted to know more about Gandhi, but very glad to find this book. It offers a lot of information in an interesting manner. I am glad to see a teenager take an interest in someone as passively powerful as Gandhi. Many valuable life lessons can be learned from his life!

Having lived in India in the 60's I read this on the eve of a recent trip back. It was a time warp from Partition to the present. What an interesting man Gandhi was. I read this on my Kindle, then purchased the hard copy to have in our library.
